May I Please Have Another Abuelo (Grandfather)? And Buñuelos Chuecos (Crooked Buñuelos)

Buñuelos is a dessert made from fried dough covered in cinnamon sugar. Buñuelos originated among Spain's Morisco population. Buñuelos were flavored with anise and were round and flat.

In the Mexican-American culture, buñuelos are a New Year's tradition. "During the Spanish Settlement en el Mundo Nuevo, Spanish explorers brought the buñuelo tradition with them."

My (Edna) cousins invited us (myself and my sons and daughter) to learn how to make buñuelos. One of my sons, Bryan, loved the buñuelo so much, he politely

asked, "May I please have another Abuelo (grandfather)?" My cousin responded, "You may have another buñuelo, but I'm fresh out of grandfathers". At least, I am proud of his manners because he said, "May I please..."

My Mom tried to teach me how to make buñuelos but I was always in a hurry to play so my buñuelos would always come out chuecos (crooked) instead of round. Kind of like my tortillas—chuecas instead of round. But, still delicious!
