RCRHC Border Security Chair - Clarence Jorif

Clarence Jorif is proud to be a member of RCRHC and serve you as the Border Security Chair.

Clarence is the youngest child of Winifred and Estanislaus Jorif, who were born and raised in Panama, Republic of Panama and Costa Rica, respectively. Being of Hispanic descent, Clarence grew up in a household where Spanish was spoken routinely when matters were discussed concerning him or when his parents and siblings, Julio and Marie, didn't want him to know what they were talking about. Clarence learned and has mastered Spanish fluently throughout his education and from immersion within his Hispanic surroundings. Clarence's outer appearance does

not fully disclose what's contained within.

As Border Security Chair, Clarence will utilize his lifelong experiences derived from the military, local and federal law enforcement. This knowledge will afford the RCRHC the opportunity to provide an indepth understanding of border security, human trafficking, and sexual trafficking issues that affect us at the local, state, national, and international levels.

Formerly, as a U.S. Secret Service Polygraph Examiner, he conducted polygraph examinations which were relevant to National Mission & Exploited Children investigations. As a U.S. Secret Service Electronic Crimes Special Agent (Forensic Digital Examiner) he conducted forensic examinations of digital storage equipment which resulted in the successful prosecution of untold numbers of predatory and abusive individuals.

Clarence will work closely with the RCRHC Board of Directors to provide



recommendations of renowned speakers and presentation regarding Border Security which directly affect our everyday lives.

The Poiema Foundation - Founder and Director - Rebecca Jowers

Poiema educates the public and raises awareness to prevent sexual abuse, sex trafficking, and other methods of sexual exploitation. Poiema also facilitate the restoration journey of survivors, in their Safe House, by providing for their physical, psychological, emotional, and spiritual needs through trauma-informed care. In this safe place, residents experience newfound freedom and dignity as they prepare to one day re-enter a sustainable hope-filled life. Recognizing that no child should be a slave to sexual exploitation, Poiema takes the fight of human trafficking to the streets. Their Outreach teams go into communities throughout North Texas every weekend and distribute posters of missing minors to hotels, truck stops and restaurants.

While on Outreach, these teams gather important intel for our partner organization, 4theOne, who works closely with local law enforcement. To-date, Poiema helped with the recovery of 307 minors.

The Poiema Foundation was established in 2013 when the founder, Rebecca Jowers, learned about the problem of human trafficking in her community. As a mother of four daughters and a survivor of sexual abuse, her heart was broken for trafficked children who have no voice. Rebecca, began teaching Human Trafficking 101 to anyone who would listen. Rebecca received requests help for victims who

were rescued. Resources were needed. Poiema as founded with the vision of opening a long term, trauma informed residential program. Shortly, a home was donated fully paid and furnished.

Human Trafficking - Border Security Chair - Clarence Jorif

The month of January has been designated by Presidential Proclamation as Human Trafficking Awareness Month. The awareness of Human Trafficking doesn't begin and end during the month of January.

Human trafficking has been defined as the trade of humans for the purpose of forced labor, sexual slavery, or commercial sexual exploitation for the trafficking of others. The worldwide consensus among human trafficking experts' reveals that the majority of human trafficking involves labor trafficking, but sexual exploitation is most prevalent. Women and children are quite often utilized for sexual exploitation while men are usually utilized as forced labor.

Human trafficking is a trans-national issue that is rampantly affecting the world and nearly every community in the United States. Human trafficking has been identified as a \$150 billion dollar global industry that affects nearly 25 million people worldwide. It is a wide-spread issue that takes place in urban and rural areas and on tribal lands within the United States and worldwide.

A recent conversation with Texas sheriffs located along our southern Texas border revealed that hundreds of illegal aliens

who are transited across our border by "coyotes" subsequently died due to physical abuse, murder, rape, dehydration, starvation, exposure, etc. Local law enforcement officers are usually the first to identify or make contact with potential or active victims of human trafficking. A common misconception is that human trafficking is the result of underground operations and nefarious organizations. Unfortunately, human trafficking victims are utilized in plain sight within restaurants, cleaning services, construction projects, and other commonplace businesses. They are usually discovered by law enforcement during targeted labor, drug or (Continued on Page 3)

RCRHC is looking forward to helping Selah Creek, a gospel centered maternity home for homeless pregnant women in Rockwall County and beyond.

Selah Creek specializes as a longterm program that assists women coming out of prison, drug rehabilitation, abuse or neglect. In addition, Selah Creek also helps women wanting to radically change the trajectory of their life.

Selah Creek offers a daily program which includes: continuing education, making a parenting or adoption plan, labor and delivery classes, bible study classes, boundaries, understanding and processing trauma in order to raise healthy children, relationship loss, how to cook, how to live in peace with others.

Selah Creek's mission is to provide a safe and peaceful home so that women can focus on themselves, their future and the future of their babies. Selah Creek believes that when they offer a space for a woman to stop and reflect, she has the capacity to process her life, her trauma, and her choices. Then she is free to make different choices for her future and for the future of her children, potentially change lives for generations. When a

resident completes Selah Creek's program, she has a plan for her future, money saved, and confidence in her abilities to go out and change the world!

Whoever pursues righteousness and love finds life, prosperity and honor.


